### **MASSAGE AS A SECOND CAREER**

80 hours

This course is designed for current Health Care professionals and/or those with degrees in the Health or Physical Sciences who are considering pursuing a second or complementary career in the field of Massage Therapy. Building upon the student's core scientific knowledge, this course covers the fundamental skills that will enable students to understand the interactive and dynamic process used in the assessment, evaluation and treatment of MT clients. The course consists of lectures and practical demonstrations in which students are required to actively participate. Following completion of the course, participants will not only have added to their existing skill set, but will be in a position to knowledgably assess MT as a second career option. Completion of this course may also assist otherwise qualified candidates in applying to Registered Diploma Programs in the field.

#### MYOFASCIAL APPROACH TO POSTURAL DYSFUNCTION

40 hours

The course introduces concepts and skills for the treatment and assessment of postural dysfunction, focusing on effective assessment, formulation of valid clinical impressions and the application of myofascial techniques as part of a massage.

## INTRODUCTION TO REFLEXOLOGY

20 hours

The module provides the in-class practice for providing reflexology treatments or incorporating them into a massage routine. The focus is on principles, the map of the body on the foot, and stimulation of various points to achieve treatment aims.

# **INTRODUCTION TO PREGNANCY MASSAGE**

The course introduces students to the intricacies of maternal changes and fetal development, which serve as a context for understanding the necessary modifications to treatment when treating pregnant clients at the different stages of pregnancy, and provides an opportunity to treat pregnant clients.

# **HUMAN RELATIONS, ETHICS & JURISPRUDENCE**

30 hours

The relevance of legislation and ethical issues to professional practice is emphasized. Throughout the course, human relations and ethics serve as the basis for understanding and describing jurisprudence and to reflect on MT practice. The workbook promotes self-reflection, as well as, assists students in researching and understanding relevant legislation (details of jurisprudence) in preparation for practicing as a regulated health care professional.

# ADVANCED CLINICAL ASSESSMENT SKILLS

This course provides students with the skills needed for forming accurate clinical impressions. Subject matter includes regional neurological, orthopaedic and cardiovascular assessments.

**RESEARCH LITERACY** 40 hours

The focus of the course is on the role of critical thinking and inquiry in clinical decision-making. It lays a foundation for research literacy – reading, assessing and applying research findings, and promotes clinicians as life-long learners. Students hone skills in developing and implementing a systematic approach to forming valid clinical impressions based on key parameters and comparing clinical data.

# REMEDIAL EXERCISE APPROACH TO POSTURAL DYSFUNCTION

40 hours

Students will examine variations in scoliosis, as well as upper and lower crossed syndromes (hyperlordosis and hyperkyphosis). Once a clinical impression is derived, students will use specific techniques to treat the particular postural dysfunction. Focus is on assessment and the use of the ice and stretch technique.

### **INTRODUCTION TO SUIKODO®**

20 hours

This module introduces students to fundamentals of Suikodo philosophy, theory, assessment, and treatment techniques.
