CONTINUING EDUCATION

MASC—Massage as a Second Career - This 80-hour Continuing Education Unit, open to those with degrees in the Health or Physical Sciences, will introduce massage and hydrotherapy techniques, discuss therapeutic relationships, build palpation skills and introduce students to a clinical setting. Any course that fulfills the requirement of 80 hours and covers the above listed skills with a minimum passing grade of 70% will be considered for entrance into Year 2 of the Massage Therapy Program.

YEAR 2 - MASSAGE THERAPY PROGRAM

CATS200 - Clinical Assessment & Treatment Skills - 410 hours

This course builds on knowledge acquired in prior learning and requires increased proficiency in clinical assessment and treatments. The course focuses on the treatment of advanced musculoskeletal conditions, neuropathies and systemic conditions.

CLSK200 - Clinical Skills - 80 hours

This module is an integral component of CATS200 and focuses on enhancement of anatomical palpation and assessment skills, emphasizing an effective and rationale approach to assessment and clinical decision making.

RLIT200 - Research Literacy - 36 hours

Introduction to research literacy—reading, assessing and applying research findings. Case methodology supports learning.

ELCT200 - Electives - 40 hours

Two 20-hour elective modules introduce students to different focus areas enabling them to expand upon their basic knowledge and understanding in specific areas. Course offerings are subject to change.

MAPD200 - Myofascial Approach to Postural Dysfunction - 40 hours

This course introduces students to myofascial techniques focusing on selective and appropriate use of techniques, and their integration into a massage treatment.

PATH200 - Pathophysiology - 210 hours

The focus of the course is on understanding pathophysiological processes in various body systems. Special topics relevant to the practice of massage therapy are introduced, including neuroanatomy, neuropathies, pain and stress.

PRMT200 - Practice Management - 34 hours

This course introduces students to the issues related to career development and practice management in massage therapy.

TECL200 - Teaching Clinic - 250 hours

The Clinical Education component of the program enables students to assess and treat members of the public in a safe and supportive learning environment. Professionalism and effective communication with clients is an integral part of the course.
